## ES Grade 4 Expectations for Transitioning from Apple iPads to Laptops 2026/2027

Dear Families,

In grade 4, your child moves from using an Apple iPad to using a laptop through our BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) Program. Students make this transition to facilitate the greater need for typed written work when researching, creating, and documenting.

Below you will find the recent technology guidelines as well as advice on how to support them in practicing some of the skills they will need. From this point forward in your child's education, a laptop is the expected device at AIS to support learning with technology.

Internet Access		
<p>Internet access is important as it allows your child to share work with their teacher, classmates, families, do research, and more. Our clean filtered internet enables safe access to approved content when students are connected to school wi-fi.</p> <p>Classroom teachers will assist students with connecting to the wi-fi. Students who were previously connected using the same device will automatically reconnect at the beginning of the school year.</p> <p>Personal cell phone hotspots and personal internet routers <u>will not</u> be permitted at any time.</p>
